April 5, 2024 ANTI-SLAVERY ADVOCACY AND ROBINSON FAMILY Dr. Lindsay Varner, Executive Director of the Rokeby Museum in Ferrisburgh, will share the history of the Robinson family home (1793-1961), its abolitionist history, and stories of the Freedom Seekers who sought self-emancipation in the Underground Railroad.

Thirty camps, two in nearby Plymouth, and one in Mendon which later became a Girl Scout camp, were established to build roads, trails, plant trees, and to build and maintain fire towers.

May 10, 2024 RETURN OF THE AMERICAN CHESTNUT TREE

Retired science teacher **Tom Estill** will speak on the demise, and the ongoing effort to restore, the American Chestnut, once a mainstay of our forests that was decimated by blight in the early 1900's. The American Chestnut Foundation has worked to reintroduce this tree to its former prominence.
